

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Is it February or June? Can't hardly tell by the turn-outs we have had at the field in the last 30 days. If you haven't made it up you've been missing out. There has been some great flying weather in between the rain and wind and fortunately I have been able to take advantage of at least some of those days.

We have some real fun events scheduled for this year so you want to make sure and keep up with the calendar. Pylon racing, Combat, along with our usual events. Should turn out to be an exceptional year. In addition, the May 15th Opening day Airshow is shaping up to be one of the best we've ever had so tell everyone you know. This will probably be our biggest fund raiser of the year so we want to really talk it up. We will let everyone know as to the exact admission price and other details but believe me, this will be our own little PCAM. Speaking of which, I believe we are scheduled to fly again this year at the PCAM Airshow so that will be a must see also.

There has been some growing concern about unauthorized flying at the field so just wanted to make sure everyone understands the rules on that.

It is okay to bring a guest (did you notice I said **bring** a guest) with you to the field to let them check out the field and see if they would like to join. They can do this twice if they are

flying and then are expected to join. Anyone can come up to watch and there is no limit to that. As a matter of fact, we encourage that. What is not okay is for someone to continue to come up and fly whenever they want without joining the club.

As with all things we do have a few exceptions. We may have a special guest from time to time that has a particular type of plane or experience that all can enjoy and benefit from. Still the guest should be accompanied by a paid member and it is preferred if that member can let the board know in advance so we can get the word out something special is going to take place at the field. We feel confident that all members will respect this and abide by the rules of the club. Air shows and events are other areas where we would not expect people to join the club but the AMA rule still applies to anyone flying at our field. Also, we may have a visiting fellow flyer who is here for a short time but would like a friendly place to fly. Let's show them our hospitality and welcome them. The same club rules apply for such a person but we want to invite them to fly as an extended guest. If someone knows of such an individual, please let a board member know so we can welcome them also.

Sharing the freq pins is going to become more frequent as the club grows so get used to it. It is a rare thing that a club of this size does not have to deal with this so it is nothing new. If your keeping the pin and your working on your plane, let it go if someone else needs it to fly. Make sure and impound your radio at that time. This is also something we really need to crack down on. I can't stress this enough: **IF YOUR NOT FLYING, IMPOUND YOUR RADIO.** We will start having planes shot down if this is not strictly enforced.

Rules are everywhere. Where we work, live or play so we shouldn't be discouraged by them but recognize they are there for a reason. It's for our safety and a way to help us keep organized and to protect our field. It's a good thing. Remember to treat others

like you would like to be treated. Yes, we have to have rules but the way we enforce them can mean the difference in welcoming a new member or running people off.

The club is growing, not just in numbers but in the quality of our membership. Let's each of us continue to be a part of this momentum and enjoy the camaraderie of our fellow aircraft enthusiasts.

On a different note: The meeting attendance has also seen some growth this year and it is a great thing to see. We are having some great prizes and are having fun and staying informed of what's happening with the club. This month we will finalize whether or not to keep the 50/50 part of the raffle or have bigger and better prizes. Hi all, Happy New Year! At the next general meeting I will be starting a multi-part how-to clinic designed to uncover the tips and tricks of advanced aerobatic flying. We will cover a new topic each month and there will be at least one hands on demo at the field. This month general aircraft and radio setup for aerobatics will be covered. I think there will be considerable interest and I hope you all will enjoy it.

Racing is back! We had a sport Quickie 500 class a few years back that was a ton of fun. We had several races and the participation was great. We stopped because the standard AMA 3 pylon course was too big for our field. After hearing several pilots say they would like to try it again, I have come up with a new course that will work fine at our field.

The AMA course is a triangular 3 pylon affair with the pilots standing at the base of the triangle and flying around themselves. The new course will be just 2 pylons and be set up parallel to the runway. This will be easier to fly, easier to keep same and fun for all. If you have seen Steve and I rat racing together you will get the idea.

The planes will be any Quickie 500 legal design with an O.S. LA .40 engine and a Master Airscrew 9x6 prop. I have ARF plane and engine combos for \$164.99.

The goal is once a month races, so come by the store or call for more info. Maybe we should do a racing clinic too!

Here is some more detail on Kev's latest project.

Here is an update on the bf-109 I'm building. The fuselage is built out and ready to be skinned. Pushrods are in place and the skins are made. I'm waiting for the engine (Moki 1.8) to get back from a company called Air Hobbies. They fabricate custom in cowl muffler systems that are actually the muffler and vibration isolated engine mount-all in one! Really slick design, and QUIET. Unfortunately, they aren't cheap. But the engine/muffler will be nicely concealed in the cowl. Oh, and the exhaust will exit thru SCALE stacks!!!! Cant skin the fuse. out till I get the engine/firewall figured out.

I included a picture of the airframe and pilot. The pilot is an EXACT scale German pilot in a North Africa summer attire. He wears the parachute, harness, flare gun, p-38 pistol, oxy. mask, goggles, boots, helmet.....etc.

I have never built a plane that flies with a pilot-cuz they all look like crap. Then I found this guy. He possess the proper attire and is therefore "worthy" of a scale cockpit.

I have spoken to a couple of fliers who have built this kit. One is Pat Mcurry who owns PCM models and has built 3 of these. They are awesome fliers, and finish out very scale. One in particular placed well in Scale Masters before PCM introduced their model. The Dave Platt kit is pretty easy to build, and is pretty straightforward. I did incorporate some changes-new techniques and materials

that weren't avail. when the kit first came out.
Thanks for the update Kev, can't wait to see it.

Combat Air Squadron Instructions

1. All Pilots will fly 5 Rounds.
2. Each Round is 4 minutes.
3. There will be a signal 1 minute before each round.
4. Another signal will sound the start of the round.
5. The combat flying zone will be 100 ft. in front of the flight line.
6. The flight line is the safe zone.
7. After 4 minutes there will be a signal to end the round.
8. Landing will be in a spot zone 60ft X 60 ft for extra points.
9. Spot landings will be one at a time if possible.
10. No aircraft shall be retrieved until the round has ended and all aircraft have landed.
11. Streamers will be 30 ft. with a 5 ft string leader.
12. In Case of a tie at the end of the combat contest, the highest previous round will determine the winner.

Scoring

Fly 4 minute round	50 points
Airborne at start of round	25 points
Land and stop in spot zone	25 points
Cut streamer	25 points
Continue to fly after mid-air	25 points
Fly over the safe zone	-50 points
