Board Meeting Minutes

March 1, 2005

-The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Chairman Guy Nicholas. All board members were present.

-Guy started off the meeting with a discussion of excessive engine noise at the field. Due to several members ignoring our sound level rules, we have to go back to checking all aircraft intending to fly at the field. We have received several noise complaints from our neighbors at the north end of the runway and they also don't like us flying out over their houses. We will also be monitoring our no-fly zone rules. All flying must be kept within the borders of our flying site. There are signs posted at the field so there is no excuse for not following the rules. Violation of these rules may result in a suspension of flying privileges for the individual involved. Our right to use the area for flying model aircraft is being put in jeopardy by a few individuals and we can't allow this to happen. The county does not like to be bothered by these complaints from the neighbors.

-A discussion of alternate flying sites available in the area was held with Mike Cracchiolo stating that he may know of some available property near Sebastopol. Steve Cole volunteered to check with the Army Corp of Engineers for a piece of available land. We all need to be on the lookout for land with the potential of being suitable for our use. At the next general meeting, we will be putting together a committee to look into this subject as our days at our present site are numbered.

-Phil Leech read a letter that he received from Larry Frank concerning our latest problems at the field.

-Gary Child volunteered to head up a committee to get some more definitive guidelines from the county concerning our flying field.

-Mike and Steve will be getting together to gather up the prizes for the next general meeting. If anyone has any suggestions on what they would like to see raffled off, let one of them know of your desires.

-Steve filled us in on the details of the planned birthday party to be held at the field. There will be 16 kids and it is expected to be held on Saturday, April 2nd. Several members have graciously agreed to help out.

-Phil gave us an update on the swap meet he and Patrick O'Halloran have planned for the late spring.

-There being no more business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:00 pm.

-Sid Maxwell and John Reade have finalized their plans for the July 4th float fly at the Salvation Army pond. It should be lots of fun. If you've never tried flying off water, put some floats on just about any kind of plane, trainers included, and give it a try. It's

exciting and different and loads of fun. Just be sure to waterproof your radio and safety tie your engine to the fuselage. Just ask John about that.

-Mike Cracchiolo says he's working on setting up a new heli pad.

-The president presented the following list of qualified flight instructors: Rob Jensen, Steve Cole, Mike Cingari, John Reade, Julio Alvarez, Phil Heidt, and Art Sutter. Note: This doesn't mean that you can't buddy box with another pilot, but you need a flight instructor to sign off on a training manual and to solo a new pilot. Also, there are plenty of flight training manuals in the file cabinet at the field for those that need them.

-Brian Blackburn presented the treasurer's report and announced that we have 88 members paid up at this time with more expected soon.

-The secretary's report was voted on and approved as printed in the last newsletter.

-Phil Leech gave us an update on the swap meet he and Patrick O'Halloran have planned for the spring. At this time, it is planned to be held in the west parking lot of the Vets Memorial Building.

-Steve Cole reported that he received a request from a non club member for a birthday party for 16 kids to be held at the club field on March 5th. After a short discussion, it sounded like it would be a great idea and was Okayed by the membership. Steve will work out the details and several members agreed to help out.

-Guy related the details of several of his recent crashes. While flying his heli one day, it suddenly went out of control for no apparent reason. Upon inspection of the crash site, he found that the crystal had fallen out of his receiver thereby causing him to lose control. This is a very unusual occurrence. A few weeks later, while flying in a pylon race, his racer lost control and landed in the grass. At first he thought it was just his flying in the heat of battle, but it turned out that he had another crystal part company with the receiver while in flight. Lesson learned. He now tapes all his crystals in securely. He used to fly JR radios so those of you with JRs might want

to consider doing the same thing. His synthesized Futaba radios don't have that same problem.

-Rob announced that the next pylon race will be on February 27th. There were 15 participants at the last race so there should be another good turnout, weather permitting.

-For show and tell, Dan Coffman brought in his recently completed Bridi Aircruiser.

-Raffle time: The first ticket drawn belonged to Larry Miller who chose the Viper pylon racer. Guy was the next winner and he picked an OS .40 LA engine. Other winners were Ken Melani, Brody Carlson, Joe Giddings, Brian Blackburn, John Reade, Joe Kagan, Tom Haddorff, Mike Cracchiolo, Steve Cole, John Lehtio, Bob Rose, Phil Leech, and Curt Hiner, who chose the coveted hinges.

There being no more business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:45 pm.

Larry Miller built a Fokker DVII model from scale plans and wood cut from a kit cutter outfit a few years ago. The model, with a wingspan of 75", weighing 20 pounds was powered by a ZDZ 40 cc gas engine. It is a beautiful, highly detailed scale model complete with scale pilot, machine gun and an articulated Mercedes Benz engine (1918 Benz that is). The model is so gorgeous that Larry had a problem with it. He didn't want

Hint for stuck pistons on Old Engines:

Check out a product from your local gunsmith store called "BREAK FREE" . Pour the "Break Free" into the glow-plug hole and the intake/exhaust port. Also, remove the back plate and pour into the bottom end of the engine. Let it soak awhile then clamp the engine in a vise and apply

heat with a heat gun. Using a gloved hand to rock back and forth gently working the crankshaft until it loosens up allowing the piston and crankshaft to rotate.

This is why I fly sailplanes.
