The Board Meeting commenced promptly at 7:00 at Guy Nicholas" Adobe Software Office.

Roy Domke reported that he had a call from Susan Klassen, Deputy Director of Transportation and Public Works. Susan had read our September Newsletter and asked we correct the comments that Guy had included in his "President's Report" column regarding the status of the County's review of our lease for 2007. Susan explained that there will be letters sent to our neighbors on Alexander Valley Road to inform them of a meeting by the Public Board of Supervisors and that our lease will be on the agenda with approval of our lease being contingent on the outcome of this meeting. Guy will revise the content of his article and republish the Newsletter and post it on our website.

Roy Domke told us that he has contacted AMA to request assistance that may be available regarding club's experiences with local County's Parks and Recreation Departments. AMA is sending material to Roy. They also referred him to a Mr. DeCou who Roy has talked with. Roy is working toward a presentation to Parks and Recreation for a meeting regarding Future Planning.

There was discussion about Pylon Racing safety issues. AMA requires the use of Hardhats to all participants. We have Hardhats in the storage shed but we have never used them, All spectators should be confined behind the spectator line. It was suggested that the North pylon could me moved east, away from the runway and that the race course would then be in a diagonal direction as related to the runway. These ideas will be presented to Patrick O'Halloran.

Sid announced the "Trek to Ukiah" and told us that we could all meet at the field on Saturday at 9:00AM to form a caravan to the Ukiah field.

Steve Cole told us about an inquiry he has had from a group called the "8 series BMW" club. They would like to schedule a lunch at our field for the 1st Saturday in March 2007 and have asked whether we could flight demos and maybe some buddy box experience for their members. They expect they could number 40 cars or so.

Sid reminded us of the upcoming Float Fly on October 15 and that he plans a work party to clear seaweed on Wednesday, Oct 11.

The 2006 Christmas Party was reviewed and it was agreed that we could reserve \$1300 for prizes. John Reade will be the Raffle Master again this year

Jon Stychno told us about a Model Expo that Steve Elliot of Hobbytown is planning. The event is planned for February 2007 to be held at a community center in Petaluma. Steve has invited us to display some of our models that will be shown along with plastic models of planes and cars.

An election slate for 2007 Officers was discussed with the following outcome: President – Jon Stychno, Vice President – Guy Nicholas, Secretary – Phil Leech, Member at Large – Adam Clement. There will be requests for nominations from the floor in addition to this

suggested slate. Brian Blackburn has agreed to remain as our Treasurer.

Sid has purchased a Decibel meter and has been conducting preliminary tests taken at nine feet from a full throttle engine. It was suggested that field tests be taken at the property line where a 50 db reading is required.

The October meeting was adjourned at 8:30 PM.

After spending about \$300.00 to fix my heli from my PCAM incident I finally got it back in the air up at the SVRW October Fly. As usual after a crash I took it very easy. I put her into a hover, making sure everything seemed alright, followed by a few simple circuits and a landing. Then back to the bench to take a look and ensure everything looked to be in place. I didn't get a chance to fly it again until Sunday morning. I took off, flipped to inverted and did a full climb out. At about a hundred feet I rolled her back over and was in medium speed forward flight when I heard the, "Whap, whap, whap" of a fluttering blade followed by a slight right turn. The sound made me think I lost a control link on a single blade, but then I

realized I had no control. I hit throttle hold to prevent it from getting too out of control and to protect the people. The blade flutter is pretty loud so everyone had turned to see what hit the ground. To their surprise it hadn't hit yet, and they all got to watch as it basically fell to the ground. Let's see, I spent \$300 on my PCAM flight, got just over one flight on it, and I will probably be into this one for about \$500 as it did damage to the engine and muffler, as well as most of the bodv. The post crash inspection revealed that a screw on the inner part of the swash plate came loose and stopped it from spinning resulting in a loss of the entire control section.
