The Sonoma County Board of Supervisors has extended our lease at the Healdsburg Refuse Transfer Station Flying Site. The decision was made at a Board of Supervisors meeting in January. 20 members of the Wine Country Flyers were present to show their support. I would like to extend a big thank you to Paul Kelley and the rest of the board for their help. Also, thanks to Roy Domke of WCF, Susan Klassen from the Department of Public Works, WCF member Chris Seppler, and the dedicated officers and members of the Wine Country Flyers for devoting time and effort to securing our site for another year.

As you might have figured out, as of April 2008, the Wine Country Flyers will have to vacate our current location, and find a new home. This is due to anticipated developments in the area. This is something that we all knew was going to happen eventually, and since early 2006 we have been exploring many options for a new location, and we have the support from the county to help us accomplish this task. The WCF officers and board have been researching new sites, and we also have contacted the Sonoma County Parks & Recreation Department, requesting that the Wine Country Flyers be considered in future park development plans. My vision is to have a "R/C Park", open from dawn to dusk, with a paved runway and top notch facilities. Many clubs around the country have acquired flying sites of this quality by working with their local government, and I see no reason why we cant do the same. If any members have ideas or suggestions to help us reach our goal, please let me know.

This event took place on Saturday the 10th. The next item up for discussion was Larry Frank at 8:33. Larry passed away on February 2nd 2007. The club wanted to recognize his contribution to the Wine Country Flyers organization. Phil read a well

written letter regarding his help with the club over the years, and his devotion to the model aviation community. Larry is survived by his wife Dorothy and three sons. A unanimous decision was made to donate \$100.00 to Becoming Independent, in Larry's name. This is an organization that helps mentally challenged people.

Exciting news about PCAM was next. This year our club will have a full page in the program. Design of this page was not explored but will be a topic in upcoming meetings. Also our demonstration time will be extended to accommodate more pilots and lengthier routines. We will again have another raffle give away. The plan is to further restrict our flying with a new "No Fly Zone" being imposed. Roy reviewed a handout he has prepared, based on work Larry Frank did years ago when the field was first opened in 1992. Roy will print up 10 copies of the handout to distribute to the Supervisors and other interested parties. - Christmas Party Report.- The \$30/person we charged everybody just covered the cost of the meal plus tip and we spent about \$1300 for prizes. In Memorium: Larry Frank 1921-2007

Larry Frank passed away Sunday, Feb 4, 2007 after a long, long struggle with heart disease. Larry had been diagnosed as terminal way back in 2000 with his doctor telling him to get his affairs in order because he had less than a few weeks to live. So, Larry gave a bunch of his airplanes and flying stuff away, got his bills paid and began preparing for what he thought was inevitable. But it wasn't inevitable and Larry overcame debilitating obstacles to persevere and to continue building model after model.

Larry wasn't a founder of Wine Country Flyers, he was better than a founder because it was principally through his efforts that we were able to acquire our field at the Transfer Station in Healdsburg in 1992. Larry's contribution to Wine Country Flyers is unparalleled by anyone then or since. He was President, Treasurer and I'm not sure of all of the offices that he held. He built the picnic tables that we use today. He conducted db testing much like we're doing today in order to convince the County to back us

up as he determined that we were complying with the County's Sound Ordinance. Larry initiated displays at Coddington Mall to bring the message of our hobby to the public and he originated a program to educate kids at public schools about what we do and about basic principles of flight.

Larry was a scale model builder but he didn't just build scale models from kits he was a scratch builder. Larry would contact the Smithsonian and procure scale drawings of whatever airplane he was interested in and then he would draw his own plans. Engineering the model as he worked his way through the project, he would estimating weights to determine balance and locating a center of gravity.

Larry was a scrappy fighter refusing to give in to his deteriorating condition until the last few months when his strength gradually weakened him to the point that he was bedridden and could no longer plan or build models. But his interest in Wine Country Flyers never wavered and he was always anxious to be updated on the latest events and developments.

We will all miss his dedication and energy.

Larry requested that no ceremony be held in his memory but he did ask that memorial contributions be forwarded to: Becoming Independent, 1425 Corporate Center Parkway, Santa Rosa, CA 95407. The Wine Country Board of Directors has sent a contribution in Larry's memory.

Larry Frank was a wonderful friend to me.

Pylon Racing 2007

Spring is approaching fast, and its packed full of exciting events! The Pylon Racing season kicks off March 4th, with 3 classes of competition. There will be the trainer and Q-500 classes, and the new "Electric Reno Racer" class promises to be a exciting addition to the program. There will be 2 divisions of Reno racers,

Stock- which will consist of 400 brushed powered Reno-style warbirds, and Unlimited, which will feature warbirds powered by brushless motors up to 450 size. Wingspans are limited to 40 inches. There will be a points series in all classes, concluding in the fall. For further details on rules, contact Contest Directors Adam Clement and Steve Cole at Awesome Hobbies. They have many options of racers to choose from. There also will be some rule changes for the 2007 season. Hard hats or helmets will be required for all racers and callers. This is mandatory per AMA rules. The pit area will be off limits to everyone except racers and callers during races, and there will be no open flying between morning practice until the final race is completed. These rules were put into place for 2 reasons- First and foremost, for the safety of club members and spectators, and second, to be able to get through the numerous races in a timely manor. If you are planning on open flying on the first Sunday of the month, keep in mind that the field will be closed for racing until early afternoon. See you at the races!

Board of Supervisor's Meeting

23 Jan, 2007

The Board of Supervisor's Meeting was held at 8:30am at 575 Administration Drive, Room 102A to determine whether the County would agree to extend our revocable license agreement for another year to expire after April 14, 2008. We had a pretty good turnout of club members in support of the extension including: Doug Boucher, Larry Miller, Des Shapiro, Steve Cole, Brooks Robertson, John Lehtio, Roy Domke, Jon Stychno, Ralph Grella, John Stoufer, Patrick O'Halloran, Sid Maxwell, Guy Nicholas, Phil Leech, Bill Van Asdian, Bob Rose, Gary Child, Jim Page and Richard Maddox – 19 members! I was impressed with the turnout because I know more guys would have shown up but because of commitment to jobs it was in many cases impossible. Thanks to everyone who was able to make it. This issue means so much to most of us and it was apparent with this kind of response.

We had to wait for our turn on the agenda as three other presentations preceded our case, but at 9:45 it was our turn to make our presentation before the five elected Sonoma County Supervisors. Susan Klassen of the Department of Transportation and Public Works explained our case to the five Supervisors telling them about the letter that was written to us to end our term at the field because of complaints about excessive noise and over flying neighbors properties. She also told them about the meeting that we had with them to try to resolve the noise problem and the fact that since the meeting with our

promises to correct the problems, the complaints had dwindled substantially. Because of this she felt justified in allowing us an extension of time to find another flying site and recommended that the Supervisors grant us an additional year to try to find another site. Susan prepared a letter that was sent to adjoining neighbors and she received 8 responses, most against but with some for our staying for an additional year.

At this point the chair asked if there was any response from the public and there was a vigorous response from a neighbor who expressed anger about noise from our airplanes. He specifically mentioned noise caused by Jets. He also accused everyone of back room dealing to extend our time at the field for an additional year when he thought that we were going to be gone this coming April.

After the remonstrator finished his remarks, Roy Domke addressed the Supervisors explaining that we had taken db readings with various airplanes flying over varying areas including directly at the neighbors property lines and that the db readings were within County noise regulation restrictions. Roy went on to outline our "Learn to Fly" program that is directed toward youths. He also explained that we have not allowed Jets to fly at our field and that we have made efforts to reposition our flying so that we are further from the eastern part of our flying area.

Supervisor Mike Reilly asked whether we had made any progress toward locating a new flying site and Roy mentioned the site along East Side Road but that we really don't have anything lined up at this point. Reilly agreed that we should have a one year extension but that we shouldn't expect anything beyond that.

At that point a consensus was reached among the five Supervisors to grant us the one year reprieve and the vote was recorded as 5-0 for the extension.

We are of course, grateful for this action and hope that we can find further support

from Paul Kelley and Sonoma County Regional Parks to help us find a permanent flying field and R/C Park.

Fearless Flyer Flying IMAC

Aerobatics

OK do you have the last two maneuvers down yet? Well here are two more this month and they are very interesting. The Reverse Shark Tooth and the Teardrop. One thing to remember about all of the maneuvers is you can go vertical as high

as you want. There is no limit and it gives you more time to make the maneuver look better.

3. Reverse Shark Tooth

This maneuver is performed on the right side(or left side according to the wind). Enter horizontal, pull to a 45 degree up line. In the center of the up line do a 1/2 roll. Pull to a vertical down, reduce power. Pull a 1/4 loop, add power and exit upright at the same level as you entered.

One thing for close attention is the pull to a vertical down You will find it is done quickly and a with a constant heading. Be smooth, fly precise.

4. Teardrop

This maneuver is performed in the center. Enter horizontal. Pull vertical. Pull a 5/8 loop at the top to a 45 degree down line. Half way down the down line reduce power. Pull to level, add power and exit at the same level as you entered. Keep your heading constant. Fly smooth and precise.

Each month we will discuss (2) IMAC maneuvers. The first contest will be July 7 where we will fly the (10) Basic maneuvers (4) times and it takes 4 or 5 minutes for each round. So now we are almost 1/2 way thru and look at all the fun we are having.

There are copies of the IMAC maneuvers for you in the Impound shed.

You know what they say, "practice makes perfect".
