General Meeting Minutes

19 Jan. 2010

The meeting was brought to order by Red Jensen at 7:30 pm., with 37 members present.

- The Door Prize of a gallon of fuel was won by Wayne Frederick and he walked off with a smile.

- For New Members we did have two new members and a guest. The new members are Jake Boatman and Jack Jensen who is Red's son. The guest is Larry Gustafson who later in the meeting joined up and I guess that means we really had three new members after all.

- For the President's Report, Red told us about his concern about the club's Non-Profit status and whether we should have been filing reports with the government all of these past years. Turns out that as long as our total income is \$25,000 or less we are not required to file anything with the Feds. That's a relief.

Red also told about a joint Propbusters/WCF pylon race this past Sunday. We flew at their field with Tony McDonald sponsoring the event. No one from Ukiah participated except for Tony and Jake but Dan Sciacca is interested in developing a race team from each club to meet on alternate two

week intervals like the first and third Sundays of each month. More later.

- The Treasurer's Report was presented by Jeff Penner. Last year our expenses were \$15,300 and our income was \$15,423. That's cutting it pretty close. We currently have \$7600 in our accounts and there are 46 paid members..

- The Secretary's Report was as published in the Newsletter.

OLD BUSINESS

- Red reviewed the Christmas Party and suggested that it was probably the best one that we have ever had. The food was great, the place was great, Julio's video was first rate and for the first time, we had live music! A free raffle is hard to top too.

NEW BUSINESS

- The annual Hobby Expo that is sponsored by Hobby Town in Petaluma is scheduled for Saturday, February 20. Adam Clement is the Event Director and he is lining up display models, a flight simulator and a video projector for Julio's videos. We will probably do a little flying outside at the pond weather permitting.

- Red is reviewing the By-Laws for possible revisions and updates. The next Board Meeting will discuss any changes and prepare suggested changes for presentation at the February General Meeting.

- Pylon racing rules have been formulated and published in the Newsletter and they allow for a new 1/2th scale racing class. Sunday, March 14 has been designated for the first race.

- Jon Stychno told about a solar powered charging station that was featured in Model Aviation. Jon is working on determining what materials would cost for us to build one for the field.

- Red conducted a "Name the Plane" contest. The plane he selected was published on the cover of the Newsletter. He plans to have a contest each month. Guys submitted their entries and of the entries, Red found that four were correct and put the names in the raffle cage. And the winner was: Merle MacGregor. The correct answer was the Bell XP-63 or L-39. The plane was a modified P-63 with swept wings. Red tells us that next month's plane won't be so easy.

THE RAFFLE

- Jon Stychno won the big prize, an electric "Addiction". Jeff Penner was next up taking a P-51 Thunder Tiger. Dick Maddock got a Phillips screwdriver set and Roy Domke liked the Piper Cherokee that was donated by Steve Cohen. Glider. Dave Mercer took the Deans connectors and Chris Seppeler picked the X-Acto set leaving Larry Gustafson with a Merlin Glider kit. That left Bill Van Asdlan with a set of wheels and Bob Rose who took a peanut scale Monocoupe kit and that ended the Raffle!

Odyssey of the Mind

This is a story that most modelers will love to hear.

Last Fall, Patrick O'Halloran, our webmaster, was contacted through our website requesting help for a children's group that needed assistance about modeling and the principles of flight. It was explained that a group of kids from the Austin Creek Elementary School were planning to participate in an "Odyssey of the Mind" program and a competition to be held at Santa Rosa High School in Feb. 2010. They would be competing against four other Northern California schools with the winner going on to a state competition in Sacramento later in the year. There were seven kids in the group of 3rd, 4th and 5th graders. Three girls and four boys and they knew very little about the principles of flight or how to construct a model plane. The mother that contacted Patrick desperately needed help because she and two other mothers didn't have a clue as to how to proceed. Could he help?

"Shazam". "Of course we can help", was Patrick's reply.



So, Patrick set about trying to figure out how to proceed. He started by downloading plans for a simple rubber powered balsa and tissue model that would be suitable for indoor flight. Then he contacted me and asked if I could assist him meeting the kids on Tuesday afternoons just after school for about an hour each week until the Christmas break. The plan was to help with basics of flight and construction of simple models.

The competition required 6 separate flight performances by different types of aircraft design but the design was to be by the kids themselves and not us. After Christmas the kids were to be on their own and they had about 2 months to prepare for the competition in February.

We had seven sessions with the kids and we built about two planes each with them. Steve Cole donated some rubber power stuff to help get us started. Once we had some finished planes we practiced flying the planes in the school gym where we tried to teach them about balancing and trimming the planes. The kids were very conscientious about carefully building the planes and loved the flying sessions that usually resulted in broken and damaged planes that Patrick and I were continuously repairing with them.



We parted ways before Christmas with both Patrick and me wondering how these kids were going to solve the flight challenges that the competition required. We agreed that we would return sometime before the competition to see if they needed more help.



Last week we e-mailed the mothers to see how they were doing and were invited to join

the group to see how they had progressed. Yesterday, we got a preview of the presentation of their flight program and Patrick and I were impressed with their progress and surprised by some of their solutions that neither Patrick nor I had imagined. This is the intent of the Odyssey of the Mind program, which is to stimulate creativity and to seek solutions that reflect, "thinking out of the box".

You can bet that Patrick and I will be on hand Saturday, Feb 27 at Santa Rosa High School to watch "Our Kids". What a great experience this has been. I wish this program could be repeated next year but apparently a new theme is selected each year and "Flight" was for just this year and won't be repeated until maybe sometime in the future. The bottom line here is that it is really rewarding to

see young kids responding with so much enthusiasm and interest in learning something new. I am glad that as modelers, we had something to contribute.
