## ***WCF Christmas Parties A Brief History 2000-2012***

The Wine Country Christmas Party has always been one of the best events of the year as it concludes activity for the club each

year. Let me present a picture of the event over the past decade plus. The first Party I attended was in 2000 and it was held at the Los Robles Motel/Restaurant on Cleveland Avenue that is now a gravel site for the future, as the old Motel has been torn down. The price of the party was \$25 twelve years ago and that remained the price for the next five years when we moved the party to Cattlemen's restaurant in Montgomery Village. We were there for the next six years and there are many fond memories of parties there. It was crowded and boisterous but we all had a good time and the price was right. Attendance was always about 60 or so.

When Jeff Penner joined us we were able to have the facilities of the Wild Oak Saddle Club available to us at Oakmont in 2008 but the price had to go up to \$35.

We had moved our field to Trentadue in November 2008 and the idea to have parties at Trentadue hadn't formed yet but we did move the Party to Trentadue for 2009.

The facilities at Trentadue. were first rate and much better than we were accustomed to but they did require that we hire a caterer and that was new to us. In the past we engaged a restaurant that provided everything we needed and things were much simpler then. We found out that having a catered event was more costly and we had to increase the amount we had to charge to \$40 and that began to have an effect on some of our members. So for 2009 and 2010 we went with the caterer and the \$40 charge but last year we tried something else. The idea was to do the catering job "in house" with some of our own guys and their wives. The idea was spearheaded by Guy Nicholas who drafted his wife, Wendy to join in. I drafted my wife, Ann and we recruited help from Suzanne Cole, Merle McGregor, John Reade and others to do the BBQ and serving. It went OK but there were glitches in the serving and the timing of the meal. Still, we were able to pull it off for \$30 with kids at half price. This year we managed to hold the \$30 price and Guy got

his son Chris and a friend to help with the serving and everything went much smoother.

After the party was over and we were cleaning up, Guy told me that he wanted to take a breather from the club for a while. Guy has been Past President, Vice President and has edited the Newsletter for the past nine years. He has been a Board Member for all of that time and has been a guiding force for the club. His presence and contribution to the club is hard to measure but it has been vital at times that's for sure.

I feel like we need to do something for Guy, some kind of recognition some kind of thanks. It's not quite right to let him just slip away without saying something. (ed: No, it isn't necessary, and I give most of the credit to my wife, Wendy ☺)

Anyway, the party for 2013 is up for grabs. I hope we can find someone to fill Guy's shoes.

In doing this we were able to lower the price we charged and get a pretty decent meal out of it. The first time we did it, Phil and I spent a good deal of time trying to come up with a reasonable menu. We had to go to the store a few times to price out the possible items, narrow it down to our eventual menu, then do our final trips to the store, purchasing all necessary items. We learned a number of lessons that first year, like make sure you hire some help. This year I hired my son and one of his friends to help out, and this was a huge improvement over the year before. My wife, Wendy made the salad, and the hors d'oeuvres, and then worked the kitchen. We had another friend of ours, Pascal, show up and he was a great help back stage as well. Again, we learned a few things this year (get more Asparagus), that will be passed on to next years crew.

Costs for the event went something like this:

Food:	\$420
Help:	\$100
Serving items:	\$323
Table Cloths:	\$217
BBQ rental:	\$100
Decorations:	\$ 58

We had a total of 47 paid attendees, which works out to about \$26/per person. We consumed about \$150 in wine and sodas and took in \$347 in ticket sales. We charged \$30 per adult, half price for youngsters, and super minis got in free.

I would like to take a moment and personally thank Paul Kohlmann for donating his home made beer, I thought it went down very nicely. Well done sir!

I would also like to thank Adam Clement for donating the Starbucks coffee (and taking the time during dinner to go get it). Merle and his wife Ann also came through by bringing the Potatoes.

In summary, I think we had a very nice event for a very reasonable price and the club didn't lose money doing it. I hope the club continues to do their own dinner.
