## Board Meeting Minutes January Meeting

Meeting was brought to order by Tony McDonald at 6:30pm at the offices of JDSU. All Board Members were present.

### V.P/Safety Officer Report—no report Secretary's Report—no report

**Treasurers Report**—Phil reported the account balance as \$5713.47 and that he is holding \$300 in checks to be deposited. There are currently 43 members who have renewed for 2014, which is consistent with the pace from last year. Charlie Cox's dues were returned to his family after he passed away.

Phil gave us a general profit and loss related to the many activities that the club held in 2013.

Phil also committed to produce an Annual Report within 90 days as required by the WCF Bylaws. The Board agreed to ask Jake Rosen to serve as an independent auditor again this year. (Jake has since agreed.)

**Tshirts/Hats**—Tony to post on our forum to gauge interest. Wiley suggested that we might plan to sell WCF shirts at PCAM this year as a number of people enquired last year.

**2014 Goals and Objectives**—Tony queried the Board on what goals might be set for 2014. The consensus was that we need to host more events.

Field Assessment Fee—the Board discussed doing away with the one-time assessment fee of \$100 for new members. The goal is to increase membership by lowering the bar to new members. The Board felt that the loss in income would likely be offset by an increase in membership. Currently, we are only adding 4-5 new members a year. The Bylaws were checked and they present no obstacle, but the

Board agreed that this should be taken to the Members for a vote.

**2014 Calendar of Events**—work on the 2014 was begun:

Hobby Expo—2/15

Fun Flies—3 will be held this year (Tony will handle two, Andrew Mackles to do one)

3D Bowling—proposed by Wiley, this whacky event sounds interesting

BBQ Nights—it was proposed that we might pick some summer evenings for informal meets

PCAM—Paul will manage this year

Pylon Racing—Jake McD will manage, first race will be held on March 16<sup>th</sup>

Float Fly—Merle will manage again this year, with events on April 13<sup>th</sup>, Memorial, Labor, and Independence Days

Swap Meets—we are hoping to hold a spring and summer swap meet this year

Larry Frank/Neil Taylor—needs a manager

Opening Day—needs a manager

**2014 Pylon Racing**—Jake reported that T28 and Dogfighter classes will be unchanged but that Reno 450 will be replaced by a PZ Warbird class. The rules for PZ Warbird will be largely the same as T28. Tony and Jake have been testing the Mosquito, FW190, Spit, and Bf109 and have found them to be comparable in performance.
