
Hello members;

The club trainer is finally back in service, so with that project off my table, I'm getting my Proctor Nieuport 11 airworthy again. Once I get some more airtime on it, I'll finish it up with final details, dummy LeRhone engine, etc. The model is built to 1/5th scale, so finding a suitable dummy engine commercially is not an option at this time. But a solution was found with 3-d printers! My son Steven has been experimenting with this technology for several years now, and he's getting it right. With the appropriate cut-file, he was able to print one in 1/5th scale. The final result is convincing, but the material is somewhat fragile. Additional strength will be added to it using resin, wire, and high density filler materials.


Ya-Ka-Ama Event




Spad Build

Most of the electronics are mounted to the bottom of the cockpit floor with the switches mounted on the top side with the pilot. There are two Futaba R617 receivers and the redundant battery/receiver units with all the wiring. I did my best to keep everything neat and tidy. Once that was done I glued in the formers and stringers. The landing gear is mounted in heavy duty plywood blocks and are removable until the covering is finished. There will be a hatch just behind the landing gear to access the radio equipment. That's about all I had time for this month.
